

## Genesis 9.18-29 / Faith Bible Church / 10.11.20

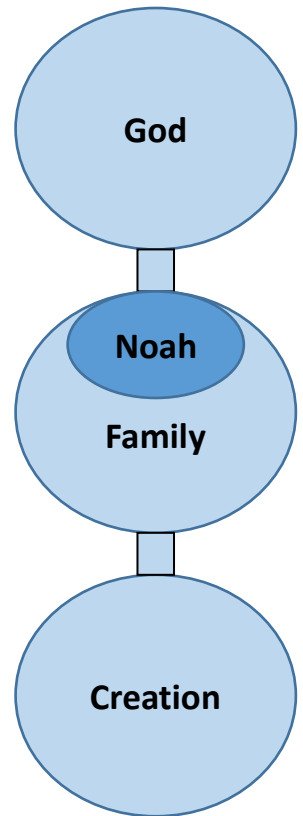
According to Deuteronomy 7.13, wine was part of Israel's \_\_\_\_\_ from God. God instructed Israel to use wine in their drink offerings [Exodus 29.40; Leviticus 23.13; Numbers 15.5-10; 28.14] and in their tithes [Deuteronomy 12.17; 14.23; 18.4].

In Matthew 26, Jesus used wine to represent his \_\_\_\_\_ when talking about inaugurating the New Covenant and the ordinance of the Lord's Table [Communion].

According to Ephesians 5.18, any instance of \_\_\_\_\_ or drug high is a sin. [See also Galatians 5.19-25; Romans 13.13.]

Allowing yourself to be controlled by any substance is allowing \_\_\_\_\_ to control you instead of the creator. This subverts God's design for people as his image bearers. Addiction, even without a high [such as is possible with caffeine or nicotine], is sin for this same reason. [See 1 Corinthians 5.11; 6.10.]

Alcoholic drinks today are 3-10 times \_\_\_\_\_ than in Bible times. The strength of THC in marijuana is 400% what it was in the 1980s. Prescription narcotic pain medications can be as addictive as crack cocaine. Dependence on caffeine is a sin.



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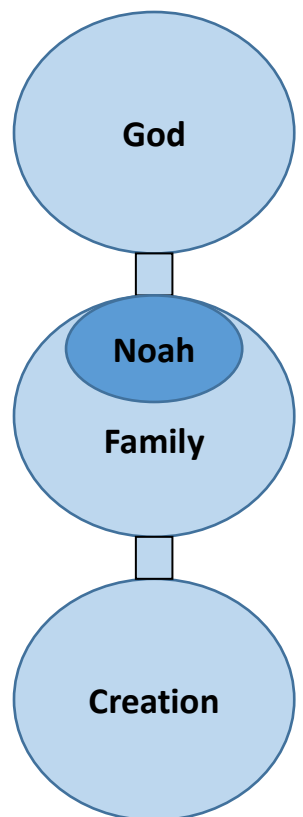
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Noah's sin was compounded because he \_\_\_\_\_ himself. Generally in the Old Testament, exposing one's nakedness or being seen naked was shameful [for example, Exodus 20.26; Deuteronomy 23.12-14; Isaiah 47.3; Lamentations 1.8].

Ham not only saw his father's nakedness, he \_\_\_\_\_ to others about it, further shaming his father. The text seems to indicate Ham took Noah's garment when he left the tent, completing his nakedness.

In contrast to Ham, Shem and Japheth \_\_\_\_\_ their father, as later commanded in Exodus 20.12. They did so by covering him while being careful not to look upon his nakedness.

Noah's curse was not black magic; in the Hebrew text it is spoken like a \_\_\_\_\_.

From Shem's descendants would come \_\_\_\_\_ and the people of \_\_\_\_\_. Meanwhile the Canaanites would turn out to be wicked slaves of sin whom God would oust from the land.

Nobody except \_\_\_\_\_ is perfect, so only he should be our ultimate hero whom we follow and emulate. Noah was a righteous man of faith, who walked with God and received God's deliverance to restart the human experience, but even Noah screwed up and sinned from time to time.
